Build Back Better: 5 proposals regarding the priority 4 of the Sendai Framework

Background



The Sendai Framework for DRR 2015-2030 was adopted at the Third UN World Conference in Sendai, Japan, on March 18, 2015. It is the outcome of stakeholder consultations initiated in March 2012 and inter-governmental negotiations from July 2014 to March 2015, supported by the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction at the request of the UN General Assembly.

Considering the priority 4 of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015 – 2030: Enhancing disaster preparedness for effective response and to “Build Back Better” in recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction, we chose 5 actions and created recommendations.

We consider that all proposals must be focused on people, and that the shape of the policies must be based on empathy to generate general trust for the process of “Build Back Better”

Recommendations



1. Institutional framework, supported by laws in order to offer cooperation, technical support, considering the crossing of borders, with a comprehensive integrated system of information with knowledge vision including all major groups and other stakeholders, such as business and industry, children and youth, farmers, indigenous people, local authorities, non-governmental organizations, scientific and technological community, women, workers and trade unions

Recommendations



2. Education, training and engagement using local tools, local knowledge, and emergent technologies to prepare people to the situation of risk and emergency considering their particularity

Recommendations



3. A percentage of public investment in research, development and innovation related to resilience, considering different aspects of resilience, such as physical, social, and psychological

Recommendations



4. To create a resilience criteria to incorporate resilience indicators for infrastructure, including in reforms and new constructions, which must be monitored during and after the construction

5. Psychological support to the victims of disasters
