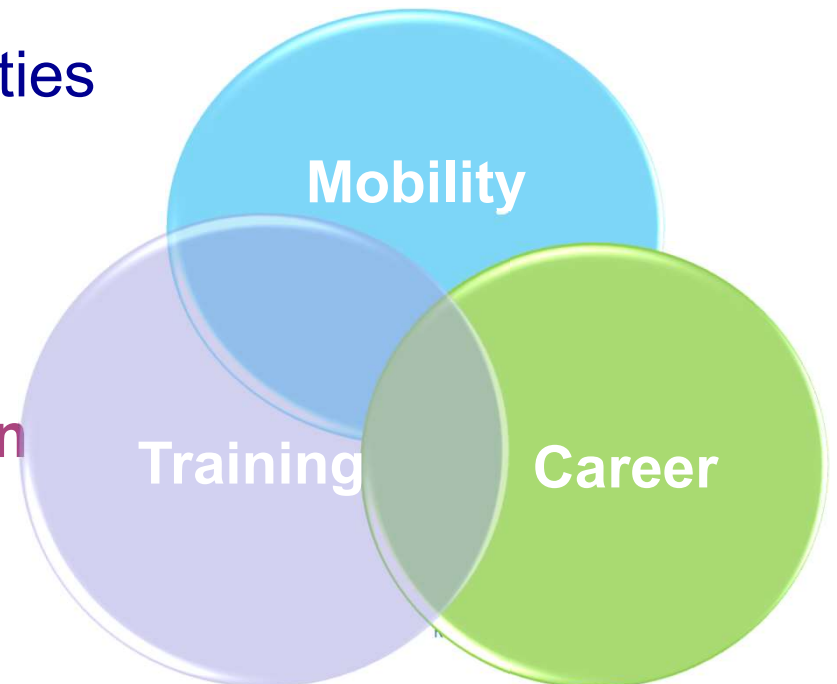

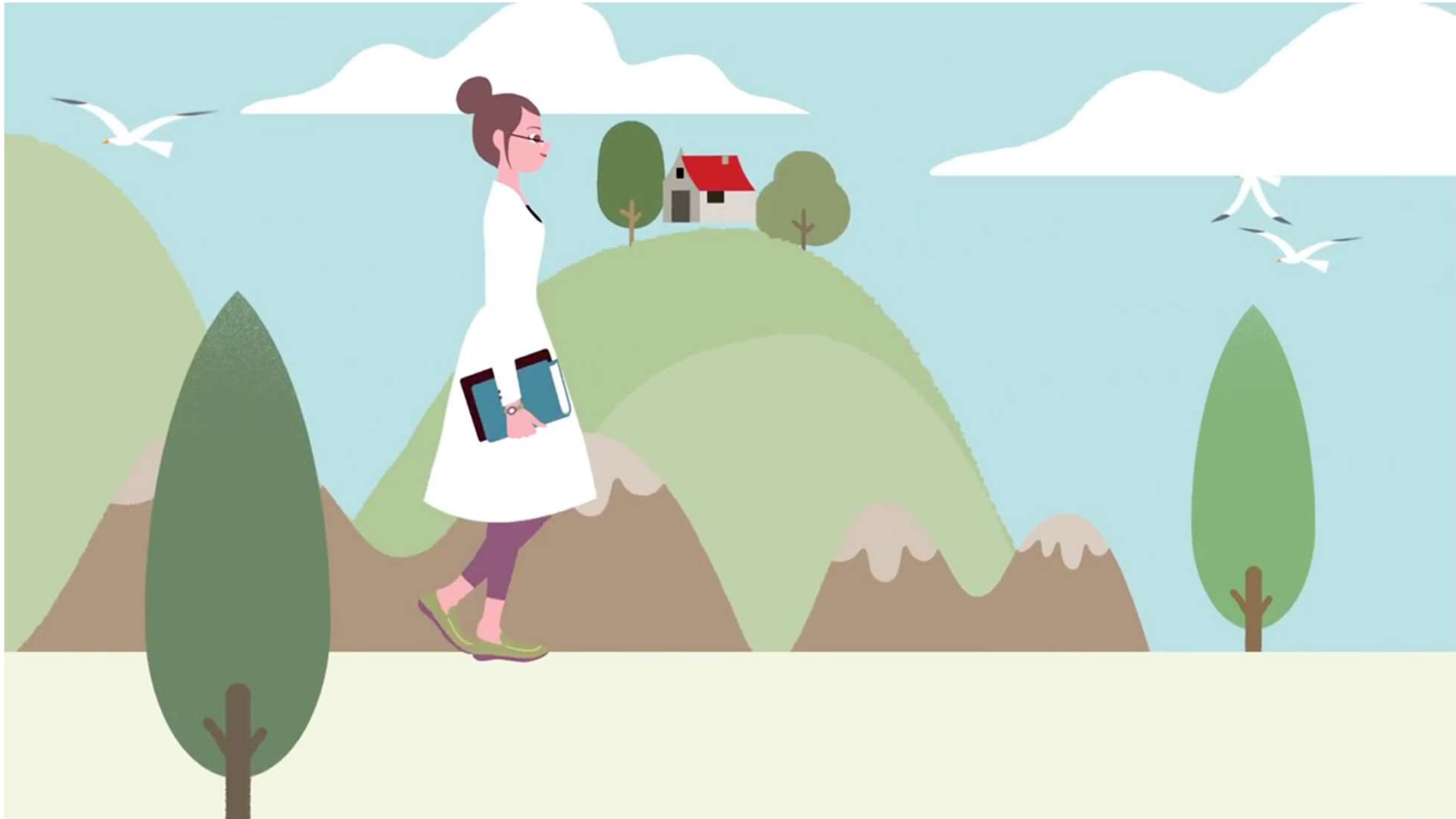

MSCA for Chile based **researchers**

Chilean researchers or based in Chile are eligible to MSCA to:

Carry out a PhD in Europe (ITN & Cofund)

⇒ EURAXESS Jobs

Carry out a post doc (IF)

with host institution based in Europe, from the academic or the non-academic sector.

Annual calls (april-september 2019)

Competitive, generous & prestigious grants

MSCA for Chilean research institutions

Chilean institutions performing research (public or private, academy or not) can **take part in a:**

- **research training network** with EU partners (ITN)
- **joint research and innovation project** through short-term intersectorial & international **staff exchange (RISE)**
- **host an EU based research for free (IF)**

The 4 Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions

Innovative Training Networks	ITN early-stage researchers (< 4 years)	Doctoral and initial training: European Training Networks, European Industrial Doctorates, European Joint Doctorates
Individual Fellowships	IF experienced researchers (> 4 years)	Support for experienced researchers to undertake international and inter-sector mobility, incl. career restart and reintegration
Research and Innovation Staff Exchange	RISE	International and inter-sector cooperation through the exchange of staff
Co-funding of programmes	COFUND	Co-funding of regional, national and international programmes: - doctoral programmes (ESR) - fellowship programmes (ER)

MSCA - What's in it for Brazilian researchers?

1. Innovative Training Networks (ITN) is the main European doctoral training programme, putting a special emphasis on non-academic sector participation and the innovation dimension.

Brazilian research institutions: This action is meant primarily for organisations such as universities, research centres or companies, that propose a research training network. Brazilian organizations can join the consortia to submit a proposal.

Brazilian researchers: can apply to the PhD positions created by these networks, including Industrial Doctorate and Joint Doctorate. They are advertised on the [Euraxess Job portal](#).

Calls are annual and advertised on the [Horizon 2020 Participant Portal](#).

2. Individual Fellowships (IF) are for experienced researchers to undertake their own research project at a host organisation in another country, thus gaining new skills through advanced training and possibly, intersectoral mobility.

Researchers based in Brazil can apply for a European fellowship, choosing to apply either for a re-integration grant, a scientific grant or a society & enterprise grant in the non-academic sector.

Researchers based in Europe can apply for a global fellowship to carry out research in a third country such as Brazil and return to Europe. They can also apply to a European fellowship for mobility within the [EU or associated countries](#).

Calls are annual and advertised on the [Horizon 2020 Participant Portal](#).

3. Research and Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE) enables international and intersectoral collaboration, based on short-term staff exchanges between organisations worldwide. The RISE programme is the successor programme of the previous IRSES programme.

Brazilian research institutions can join a consortia as partner, but can't receive direct funding from the European Commission for the secondment of their researchers.

Calls are annual and advertised on the [Horizon 2020 Participant Portal](#).

4. Co-Funding of regional, national and international programmes (COFUND) calls are open to European research (funding) institutions, Brazilian organisations can be partner organisations in a proposal. COFUND supports many high-quality fellowships or doctoral programme positions, which include transnational mobility.
